THE MUSIC OF SKYRIM

Hey, I'm back again! Taking the reigns from Tony to give another article about games and music! This time I'm thinking of a certain game that will take any Western RPG fan on a great trip. In fact, if you even see the outside in the couple of days after purchasing this game, you've got far more self-control than I. The holiday season is always when the most anticipated AAA game releases come out. One of these was the fifth game in the Elder Scroll's series titled Skyrim. I have thoroughly enjoyed this game, and tearing myself

away to write this article was difficult. I want to forewarn anyone who plays this game: it is vast. If you are easily distracted from the "main" mission in a game, you will get distracted in this game. I will let you know that I completely ignored the first mission of the game to go across the map instead. Of course, I could go on and on about how good the game's graphics, sense of scale, leveling system and gameplay are, but what I really want to examine is the music.

The music of Skyrim can't be as easily encapsulated in the word "epic" as one may think. Of course there are epic moments to be had. The theme "Sons of Skyrim" is a fully orchestrated masterpiece with a 30-man choir singing in the native language of the setting. The soundtrack varies greatly depending on the players locale in surprising ways, including compositions that forgo traditional instrumentation while within caves or dungeons in favor of subtle padding and occasional instrumental flourishes. The tense atmosphere can suddenly break with cymbal crashes and pounding timpani as an enemy, possibly a bandit or giant snake, bears down on you with the intent to take your life.

Skyrim is one of those games that can eat your free time in leaps and bounds because of how realistic it is. It can take several real minutes to travel from town to town. While this sometimes works to a games detriment it helps remind the player how small they are in a world with a rich and complex setting. The sweeping orchestra also drives the "small player in a big world" feeling for an experience that is simultaneously satisfying while making the player want to continue playing. I highly recommend it, however the Xbox 360 pressing appears to have some lag issues during scripted sequences: so be wary of that.
