



You see, each year, as a cold and unforgiving winter rolls around, musi-

cians of every caliber take to the studio, whether it be within a cozy tropical bungalow, mystic backwoods shack or polished cosmopolitan abode. They hunker down and let loose the juices of the relentless pursuit of their destiny, in search of what is rightly theirs, where late night shenanigans and early morning drives to destinations unknown are channeled and laid down into tracks spilling out the lyrical and melodic mastery of their existence.

Aaron Lee Tasjan — "In The Blazes"

This East Nashville troubadour plays in as many national tour bands as there are selections of this latest release. Tasjan is known not only for his intricate and calculated guitar playing, he also is, in many folks' opinions (including mine), the finest singer-songwriter on the scene nowadays. He has a Dylan-esque output of material, where one could easily assume he gets up every morning and has two songs written before his third cup of coffee. But, the key here is, all three of those creations contain within them words, phrases and chords that his peers would consider gold — for Tasjan, it's another piece of his being broken

And yet, as much sorrow as Parr paints with his presence, there is this strong thread of mortal beauty and essential optimism running brightly through his magnetic tone.







St. John's Conservatory Theater Casts Kreepy Hallow

There is only one St. John's Conservatory theater in all of the North Country. Of course there are other wonderful not-for-profit theater companies that produce a variety of plays such as dramas, comedies, and musicals but seldom does a small theater present all original musical comedies, one right after the other. Each show consisting of a dozen or so original songs with lyrics, all arranged and orchestrated to compliment a script bursting with memorable characters based on popular literature and folklore performed in front of a live audience for the very first time. Rapid succession world premieres are not a normal occurrence. Yet St. John's Conservatory Theater does just that. They present an entirely new and original show completely costumed, propped and staged with extraordinary orchestrations, pre-taped in a studio, which the actors then sing along with karaoke-style to great avail. Outstanding to see and hear.

Having experienced all four productions including ALICE ISN'T ALL THERE, A KREEPY CHRISTMAS CAROL, THE NEW VARIETY SHOW, and ORCHARD OF HIDE & SEEK, and I must say there is a heck of a lot of talent in this neck of the woods: actors, singers, jugglers, arrangers, orchestrators, dancers, gymnasts, set and prop designers, lighting designers, costuming and

makeup people, and that's just the half of it, I'm sure. Now the multitalented JCT team is presenting their take on the Washington Irving classic THE LEGEND OF SLEEPY HOLLOW. You know the story, the one with the headless horseman and the nerdy Ichabod Crane? Well this story is adapted to the stage in another (that's right) full-scale musical comedy just in time for Halloween! But they've switched things around a bit so it's the same story but different attitude and renamed it, after the playwright, KREEPY HALLOW.

So KREEPY HALLOW is a family-friendly musical comedy featuring an original book, music and lyrics by award-winning playwright and composer Brazillia R. Kreep. Set in the 1840's when the first appointed female teacher, Miss Ichaboda Krane, takes over the ghostly schoolroom built on-top of a sacred Native American burial ground. With a classroom filled with eclectic children, her "eye" on Bartholomeus Van Tassel, a few unexpected guests. and a jealous local woman Electra Van Brunt watching her every move, Miss Ichaboda Krane's Halloween celebration turns into a most haunting affair. Narrated by Brazillia R. Kreep himself, "Kreepy Hallow" tells the tale of Ichaboda Krane's encounter with all things that go bump in the night as the dreadful Headless Horseman rides again.

Brazillia R. Kreep (according to Wikipedia) has penned over a half dozen full-scale musicals

produced here and in the quaint seaport of Port Townsend, Washington with the highly praised traveling theatre company the Black Pearl Cabaret. Currently the writer and composer, the Chicago Tribune referred to as Edward Gorey-ish, holds the title of playwright-in-residence for both BPC and Ogdensburg's St. John's Conservatory Theater. Having seen his ALICE ISN'T ALL THERE and a KREEPY CHRISTMAS CAROL, this results in something akin to Tim Burton meets Monty Python with a little Charles Addams thrown in for good measure. It's an attractive and appealing mix to say the least. Perfect for this Halloween offering, I'm sure.

Cast with local talent from Ogdensburg, Huevelton, De Kalb, and Canton, KREEPY HALLOW stars Jillian LaBel as Alia Hobbs, Hailey Weber as Ravinia Hobbs and Parthenia Goste, Dee Bellinger as Etta Hobbs, Grace Brunet as Abitha Hobbs, R O'Donnell as narrator Brazillia R. Kreep, Angela Conzone Dwyer as Ichaboda Krane, Cole Siebels as Thaddeus Frye, Myah Myers as Felicity Caldwell, Christopher Rodriguez as Abner Frye, Haley Dawley as Mercy Faith, Grace Wills as Oheo Seneca, Megan Gardner as Chasity Smyth, Emma Murray as Charity Smyth, Christopher Dwyer as Bartholomeus Van tassel, Shelly Murdock as Electra Van Brunt, and Ryan Woodard as the Town Crier.



The Gift - Movie Review

This slow cooking, expertly crafted thriller is a predator that silently stalks the audience. When it pounces it's deeply satisfying.

Jason Bateman (Simon) and Rebecca Hall (Robyn) are a seemingly happily married affluent couple who move to Los Angeles for Simon's new high powered corporate executive job. Their new house in the hills is a mid-century one story with great views and big glass windows in every room. It is like living in a big fish bowl or to coin another phrase, "those in glass houses shouldn't throw stones."

Very early in the film, Simon and Robyn, while shopping run into Gordon (Gordo) (played by writer/director Joel Edgarton.) Simon has trouble recalling Gordon at first but then remembers they went to high school together some twenty-five years ago. Gordo insinuates

himself in the couples' life, by mysteriously dropping off gifts, and visiting unannounced. He just creepily appears on the walkway, visible through a window, approaching their front door. Although Gordo's attentions seem earnest and he is all too willing to lend a helping hand, there is something decidedly odd about him and his desire to be best friends with the couple. When Alpha male Simon decides the friendship must end and assertively confronts Gordon and Gordon does seem to disappear, the real mystery and conflict begins.

Emotional stakes quickly increase in the second third of the film, as Robyn's emotional state grows more fragile and Simon, always ambitious and successful focuses on getting a big promotion. Robyn senses the experience of Gordon and what he really wanted isn't over and as she begins to investigate further she learns too much about the real relationship of the men and an incident from their past. As well a dilemma that is never obvious, but remains ambiguous throughout. Edgarton's screenplay is so skillful that you will not see the twists coming and information is revealed so subtly, that you find yourself constantly being led enthusiastically down a path that you never knew existed. However, the film never lapses into over the top thriller violence or ludicrous plot twists.

Batemen has never been better. This film proves that he has subtleties, layers and a bad boy under the boy next door sit com exterior. Clearly he can play dramatic subtext as easily as he plays perfect timing in comedy. This is perhaps why he continues to always get work. He needs to stop being underrated. I wasn't crazy

for Rebecca Hall at first, as I felt she was a bit stoic and her asymmetrical haircut and porcelain skin were distracting. But as her paranoia, confusion and fear escalate and we experience these through her, she grew amazingly likeable.

Edgarton's Gordo is never over the top and he rides the lines of ambiguity between creepiness and likeability. Edgarton pulls off an amazing hat trick as director, writer and star and all cast and crew members should be commended for this intelligent, disturbing, Cracker Jack psychological thriller. Highly original and never gimmicky, see The Gift and be drawn into this disturbing revenge story that does great justice to its genre and is perhaps the biggest anti-bullying movie of the year.

The Games, Learning, and Society Conference Meets SUNY Potsdam's "Cricket-in-a-Box"

This past summer I had the honor and privilege of attending and presenting at the 11th annual Games, Learning, and Society (GLS) conference at the University of WIsconsin in Madison. I have attended every other year since the second iteration of the conference in 2006, and have seen it grow from a small, regional affair, into one of the top games conferences in the world. In attendance were representatives from all of the major games programs in the country, including the University of Southern California, the University of Utah, the Rochester Institute of Technology (RIT), the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), and many more. It was great to rub elbows with some of the brightest games folks in the world, and to see the creative ideas that are emerging from the independent scene and university programs.

I attended and presented with two recent graduate students who studied with me in the Educational Technology Specialist graduate program at SUNY

sented the most recent version of Teaching Bad (https://www.thegamecrafter.com/games/ teaching-bad-apples), a game they co-created with me while at Potsdam, and that was featured in a November, 2014 Fourth Coast article. We saw keynote speeches from Brenda Romero (originally Brenda Brathwaite, of Ogdensburg, NY) as well as her husband, John Romero, co-founder of the Doom/Quake series, and a game design legend. Brenda's speech described her personal journey, growing up as a curious young girl in a small town, developing a passion for programming, attending and graduating from Clarkson University, and immediately going to work for the local Ogdensburg company Sir-Tech. While there she worked on a number of titles in the Wizardry series, Jagged Alliance, and others. She paid special attention to the recent problems with sexism in the games industry surrounding the Gamergate controversy, with her overall message a plea for diversity and inclusion. She finished to a standing ovation. I spoke with her after, and she said she recognized my "north country accent" immediately. She also mentioned that when she travels she always goes out of her way to travel just north enough to catch a Jreck Subs, and when she is through Potsdam she always grabs a Sergei's pizza roll. She has fond memories of the north country, and while her next home is at an "undisclosed island location," it does go to show with a sound foundation with local roots, along with curiosity and passion, the sky's the limit. Overall, the major takeaway from the conference was that there has been, and continues to be, plenty of room in the games industry for small, independent players, not just the large producers with Triple-A titles.

For our part, I likened the game we presented to a "cricket-in-a-box." That is, we were kind of like the kid who shows up to the science fair with only a small box, surrounded on all sides by people with colored liquids in fancy glass test-tubes, smoking solutions, and breath-taking transformations. And while what we did was not technically brilliant or graphically stunning, it proved to be a hit. You see it just so happened that events concluded on Dr. Kurt Squire's birthday, co-founder of the GLS conference. Kurt went to graduate school with me at Indiana University, where he was a year behind me. In 1996, as I neared the end of my program, I convinced our department chair to offer the School of Education's first simulations and games course. He agreed, and

I taught it for a year before I left, and then handed it over my roommate at the time, Edd Schneider, who also taught it for a year. At that point he too was on his way out, and needed someone to carry the torch. We both knew Kurt well, and convinced him, against his better judgement at the time, to pick up the course. Kurt ended up focussing his dissertation on the game Civilization, studied in a post-doc at MIT working with Dr. Henry Jenkins, and is now one of the most respected college faculty working in the simulations and games field in the world. So as I was about to head out, I took one of the copies of my game, and approached Kurt to give him a copy as a birthday present. He was with his wife and GLS cofounder Constance Steinkuehler (and former games czar for President Obama). I explained the concept of the game (like Cards Against Humanity for Educators), and she immediately grabbed it and said "we're going to go play this right now." Post conference everyone meets on the Union Terrace for beer and brats, and this turned out to be the game of choice. We played for about an hour, with many laughs had by all. So, in the end, it was the little "cricket-in-abox" that turned out to be a small, but delectable, cherry on top of what was a great time had by all.







When the 5th Annual Clayton Country Jam comes around this year at the Clayton Opera House Thursday September 10th through Saturday September 12th, there will be a special 9/11 Tribute Concert planned to honor our troops and first responders on Friday night.

Country singer Darryl Worley will be headlining this special 9/11 Tribute Concert. The special night will see two shows, at 5:30 and 8:30 pm on Friday at the historic Clayton Opera House. Darryl has a sincere passion for our troops at home and overseas. His first trip was back in 2002 when he visited troops in Afghanistan, Kuwait and Uzbekistan. In fact it was that trip which inspired his #1 country single "Have You Forgotten". Being from a military family that tour still managed to open Darryl's eyes to what the troops really go through in the war zone. Darryl also was able to see the great things the troops do such as improving the infrastructure, build schools & orphanages. When Darryl wrote and recorded "Have You Forgotten" he never imagined it would receive airplay on the radio let alone go to number 1 for 7 weeks or take on the life it did. According to Darryl the song was never intended to be a single, it was actually country radio that latched on to the live version he had performed at the Grand Ole Opry. Since that first visit Darryl has been back to support the troops overseas many times, and he visits USO sites here in the states as well to entertain the troops and give them a taste of home for awhile. Darryl's dedication to visiting and supporting the troops has garnered him some honors like the VFW's Americanism Award, the USO Merit Award and the U.S. Army Appreciation Award and rightly so.

To celebrate this special concert the Clayton Country Jam has really pulled out all the stops. Organizer Mac McFarlane was able to team up the American Forces Network to provide a satellite feed, sending the concert worldwide to an estimated 500,000 troops and their families. It will also be carried online by the Wrangler Network, WPBS-DT, Watertown will be filming as well as producing the live show and a broadcast partner as they will be broadcasting the 8:30 pm concert for their viewers in Northern New York & Eastern Ontario and Steve Weed Productions will be streaming the concert online at www.911tributeconcert.com. Following the death of Elvis Presley in 1977, Ronnie McDowell came out of nowhere to dazzle the world with his heartfelt and self-penned tribute song "The King Is Gone" on the independent Scorpion label. The record took off immediately, gaining airplay on country and pop stations across the country and around the world. To date, "The King Is Gone" has sold more than 5 Million copies.

Ronnie McDowell charted a string of hit singles and albums for Epic between 1979 and 1986.

When The Eagles stopped to catch their breath a few decades ago, having sold over 100 million records, collected six Grammys and enjoyed six #1 albums, Hotel California began a pioneering journey through their history-making music that has taken them around the globe and thrilled hundreds of thousands of Eagles fans.

Opening up the show on Saturday will be regional favorites, the Waydown Wailers. They are on the edge of the swamp rock, blues, and jam with just a healthy dash of good old Americana, is a sound better known as Outlaw Jam Rock. And nobody does it better than the Waydown Wailers.


